Summer and Fall Re-Entry Planning

Based on the guidelines provide for summer school, the East Windsor Public Schools will provide all summer, academic services through distance learning. More information will be coming for special education ESY as well as credit recovery or any other summer support.

The Governor's office and the State Department of Education are creating guidance for districts to use when planning for the fall. Information provided today was that further guidance was expected within the next two weeks.

Ideas have been shared in the news and other sources and we are using those models to begin problem solving. We will continue to discuss all of the factors that go into planning for fall. Teachers, parents and students will be provided with information and opportunities for input at points throughout the process. We need to receive the state level guidance first, work through some preliminary planning and then share our thoughts and ideas. We know it is a stressful topic and the lack of information is adding stress to all of you and to school staff as well.
