TRAVEL AND QUARANTINE REQUIREMENTS

I am aware that mask mandates have been changed for people who are fully vaccinated. In the East Windsor Public Schools, we are continuing to require masks in the school buildings and at any school event, indoors or outdoors. Almost all of our students are too young to be vaccinated and many have health issues that would increase their risks for contracting or having complications due to Covid – 19. In addition, not all of our staff is vaccinated. We are requiring masks at least through the end of this year to protect our students and staff – our goal is to keep our students in school 5 days per week until June 15, our scheduled last day of school.

END OF YEAR ACTIVITIES

All three of our schools are planning end of year activities including prom, graduation, 8th grade promotion and our 4th grade field day. Please check the portals for each school for information that has been sent home or any updates that may be provided in the upcoming weeks.

WARM WEATHER

I am pleased to say that warmer weather is upon us – at least for the next few days. Please send a water bottle with your children for their use during the day. We also ask that parents review the dress code for any guidelines that may apply to clothing worn in warmer weather. This includes not wearing flip flops at the elementary level for safety.

COVID VACCINES FOR 12 – 15 YEAR OLDS

As you may know, the Pfizer vaccine has received emergency authorization for use in children ages 12-15. I have reached out to the North Central Health District to determine what options there are for vaccinating students in that age group. I will provide that information as soon as I am made aware.

“OPT OUT” FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022

The Connecticut State Department of Education has shared that, at this time, they do not anticipate continuing the option of parents voluntarily choosing to have students do remote learning for the year. The East Windsor Public Schools will not allow the continuation of students “opting out” of in-person learning for the 2021-2022 academic year as was allowed by the state during COVID 19. Students enrolled in the EWPS will be expected to attend classes in person next school year. Full time remote learning has presented many challenges for students and staff and our data does not support the voluntary continuation of that option.

Some students may still require remote learning at times due to quarantine or being identified as a close contact for students who are not vaccinated. The need to use remote learning in those cases will be determined by nursing and school administration. We look forward to having all of our students back, in person next year.

COVID-19 CASES

We have had 0 positive cases since the last parent update, prior to April break.
