## **Dr. Patrick Tudryn Named Superintendent of Schools**

The East Windsor Board of Education is pleased to announce that Dr. Patrick R. Tudryn has been named Superintendent of Schools. He replaces Dr. Christine DeBarge, who was recently appointed superintendent of schools in Greenfield, Massachusetts.

"Dr. Tudryn has been a member of the East Windsor community since 2003 and we are fortunate to have such a highly qualified educational leader among our ranks who is extremely familiar with our students and their families, with our community, and with the faculty and staff," said Randi Reichle, chair of the Board of Education.

Dr. Tudryn's time in East Windsor includes serving as a teacher, an assistant principal, as director of special education, and as assistant superintendent.

Dr. Tudryn said his focus is to continue to build upon the progress the school system has made in recent years while inspiring the students, faculty, and staff to greater success in the future.

"I am eager and excited," Dr. Tudryn said. "I'm invested in and feel a strong connection to this community. You might see me at the Pickle Jar or Dunkin Donuts or at Flower Power picking up plants. I believe being a successful superintendent means being accessible to all - parents, students, teachers, and staff." Dr. Tudryn coached youth basketball in town for several years. His own children have participated in the town's parks and recreation activities. "I feel a strong connection to this community."

He said he has always had and will continue to have an open-door policy with the faculty and staff. "I've always maintained respectful, positive professional relationships with my colleagues and staff and I will continue to do that as we work collaboratively to move our schools to greater success."

Dr. Tudryn has a bachelor's degree in psychology and a master's degree in special education, both from American International College. He earned his doctoral degree in educational leadership from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst.
