### XI. NEW BUSINESS: DISCUSSION

<u>Year in Review School Updates</u> – Building Principals

- Broad Brook Elementary School
  - I-Ready Reading and Math scores on the rise
  - New Instructional Programs increasing rigor include Haggerty, Fundations, Reflex, Social Studies curriculum, & STEM classes
  - Student events include Safety presentations, Veterans Day celebration and Boot Camp, Kindness week, Author's Visit, ACES Day, & Field Trips
  - Family Engagement activities include Kindergarten Orientation, Open House, December Concerts, Family tours, & Mileage Club
  - Building capacity for instructional leadership through the development of school-wide focus and SMARTe goal in addition to professional development and coaching.
- East Windsor Middle School
  - Increase parent communication with bi-weekly newsletters with "A Few Quick Things You Need to Know at EWMS"
  - o Developed school-wide focus with student designed slogan and logo
  - Increase in student activities including 6<sup>th</sup> grade Science Fair, weekly Pawsitivity Awards, grade level school dances, sports, 14 afterschool clubs, pep rallies, spirit days, art contest and field trips
  - Community events included holiday breakfast and band/chorus concert for Senior Center, town scarecrow contest, Veteran's Day supply donation collection, Career Day, internet and social media safety night, band concerts, local author workshop, and Dr. Hill's presentation to classes on the power of words
  - o Advisory classes focused on community and climate building activities
  - I-Ready Reading and Math scores on the rise
  - Goals for next year: increase student academic growth, increase student to student discourse, and expanding the curricular opportunities for students including the talented and gifted program

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- East Windsor High School
  - Developed an instructional focus at the high school through work of the building based instructional (teacher) leadership team. Focus is on problem-solving through reading and writing
  - Implemented Exact Path, an assessment tool, this school year to established baseline academic data necessary to monitor student progress going forward
  - Instructional walkthroughs were conducted on weekly basis to support the SMARTe goal by providing feedback focused on tier 1 classroom instruction.
  - Partner and collaborate with the community through the Advisory Board to support students' pathways. Examples include Think about your Future's Week and Investment Class
  - Community exploration student activities have included Unity Day, ACEs Day, Farm to School, Model Congress, college visits, Close Up, and field trips. Five students participated and completed the CNA program and one student completed the Dymoteck program in partnership with VRABE
  - Community engagement events included the restructuring of Open House, EWHS block party, FAFSA challenge, and awards ceremonies
  - Community and celebrations this year included achievements by sports teams, the drama production of Cinderella, the positive contributions made by the National Honors Society, Leo Club, and mentor programs.
  - Additional success this year was the completion of the student study lounge as part of the winning proposal for the CSDE Voice for Change
  - Goals for next school year include expanding curricular opportunities and pathways programs

#### XII. LIAISONS' REPORTS

H. Spencer and D. Menard reported that they recently attended a final CIP meeting and reported that the BBES boilers were approved for funding. D. Menard shared that the CIP Committee members expressed during the meeting that the town is not spending the necessary funds to meet the capital improvement needs within the community. It was suggested that the BOE schedule a walkthrough of school facilities with both CIP committee and BOF members to bring a greater awareness of the capital improvement needs of the schools.
