I. CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER

VI. MINUTES

May 28, 2025 - Special Meeting Minutes: On a motion by C. Sevarino, second by H. Spencer, to approve the Board minutes. PASSED with a vote of six members in favor and one abstention (D. Menard).

VII. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

On a motion by D. Menard, second by H. Spencer, to take item New Business: Vote - Educational Specifications for the middle school/high school and Broad Brook school out of order. PASSED with a unanimous vote by all members present.

S. D'Agostino presented a report on the educational specifications. Discussion ensued regarding the Broad Brook Elementary School ed specs including FRC enrollment and the impact on space standards, design of the gymnasium, designated bathrooms, and the location of FRC students. Discussion ensued regarding the combined middle/high school ed specs including space

standards, special legislation, the design of the cafeteria, the design of the gymnasiums, the amount of bathrooms, and the design of the art spaces.

On a motion by N. Farmer, second by H. Spencer, to authorize the East Windsor Board of Education to approve the Educational Specifications for the Broad Brook Elementary School Project – State Project No. 047-TBD. PASSED with a unanimous vote by all members present.

On a motion by E. LeBorious, second by C. Sevarino to authorize the East Windsor Board of Education to approve the Educational Specifications for the East Windsor Middle/High School Project – State Project No. 047-TBD. PASSED with a unanimous vote by all members present.

VIII. YEAR IN REVIEW SCHOOL REPORTS

Year in review school reports were presented by administrators from all three schools highlighting the efforts and achievements from the 2024-2025 school year as well as goals and strategies for next year. Copies of all three reports were provided to the Board.

On a motion by H. Spencer, second by F. Neill, to go past 9 PM. PASSED with a vote of eight in favor and one opposed (N. Farmer).

IX. FINANCIAL REPORT

Dr. P. Tudryn advised this agenda item was added due to the uncertainty of the budget referendum. R. Galloway provided a brief update on end of the year projections for FY2025. Dr. P. Tudryn additionally reported that, in accordance with policy 3323, Beebe Landscaping was awarded the contract for mowing and leaf pickup services, effective July 1, 2025. Beebe Landscaping was the lowest bid out of three bids that were submitted.

On a motion by E. LeBorious, second by F. Neill, to adopt Policy 5130: Tuition For Children of Non-Resident Employees East Windsor Public Schools. PASSED with a unanimous vote by all members present.
