<p><b>Course Overview</b></p>	<p>Spanish 2 Honors builds on foundational language skills, expanding students' ability to communicate in the present and past. Students develop interpretive, interpersonal, and presentational communication while deepening cultural understanding across the Spanish-speaking world. The course emphasizes real-world communication, authentic resources, and critical thinking in the target language. This class is taught at an accelerated pace with emphasis on language structures, accuracy, fluency, and deeper grammatical control. This class includes reading a novel and a reading library with a writing component used along with the readings.</p>

	<p>This unit reviews key Spanish 1 concepts including present tense of regular and irregular verbs subject pronouns, direct object pronouns, estar with progressive usage, ser vs. estar, gustar, ir + a, tener + expressions basic vocabulary (family, school, activities, sports, likes and dislikes), question formation and sentence building structures. Students re-establish interpersonal communication skills and build confidence through speaking and listening activities. Cultural review reinforces basic knowledge of Spanish-speaking countries focusing on Hispanics in Miami and New York.</p>	<p>Students review and expand present tense usage while discussing personality, physical traits, and relationships. Emphasis on the verbs encantar, interesar, irregular stem changing verbs, familiar commands and descriptive language. Cultural exploration focuses on family structures and social norms in Spanish-speaking countries concentrating on the Caribbean countries.</p>	<p>Students explore hobbies, vacations, and past experiences using the preterite tense (regular and irregular verbs). Using indirect object pronouns and using past language structures in the past tense. Cultural study includes travel and tourism in countries such as Costa Rica and Spain.</p>	<p>Students discuss routines, hygiene, and wellness using reflexive verbs and stem-changing verbs in the present and past tense. Continuing affirmative and negative regular and irregular (tú) commands . Cultural connections include daily schedules, meals, health practices and sports or ways to stay in shape in Spanish-speaking countries with emphasis in Argentina.</p>	<p>Students use both preterite and the introduction of imperfect tenses to describe food, meals, and traditions. They learn to narrate in the past and express preferences. Cultural focus includes traditional cuisine and celebrations such as Las Fallas, World Cup Soccer and Semana Santa.</p>
